

# 2024 Partners In Mission - \$91,140

In 2024, we were blessed with many opportunities to support our mission partners through both our actions and generous giving. We were able to contribute to 14 different efforts, both locally and globally, as we worked together to serve those in need. Our congregation actively volunteered time for local initiatives, and some even traveled to other states and countries to offer hands-on support.

Our commitment as a church has always been to dedicate at least 10% of our Tithe to partner in mission each month. However, due to some financial challenges, we temporarily reduced that percentage to 5% during the spring and summer and resumed to 10% in November. Thanks to your incredible generosity through special offerings, we were able to finish the year strong, ultimately giving 17% of our Tithe to our Partners in Mission!



# Worship Attendance and Tithes

2024 was a year of growth and renewal for Prairie Creek. Our Sunday morning attendance grew by 7%, with an average of 153 people joining us each week. We welcomed 28 new members, including 9 through confirmation and the rest as adults. Our Christmas Eve services saw a wonderful turnout of 282 people across three services.

Additionally, our tithes for 2024

increased by 2.6% compared to 2023, and our expenses remained right on target with our income.

While the year was marked by many positive milestones, it also came with its challenges. We transferred 6 memberships to other churches and sadly lost 4 beloved members due to death. Our hearts ache for these losses, and we hold their families in our prayers.

As we look ahead to 2025, we recognize that we are growing and are excited that our service is becoming full. In response, we're taking the time to carefully consider feedback from focus groups and assess the best approach for scheduling worship services to accommodate our growing community. We are excited for what lies ahead, and grateful for your continued presence and support.



#### **Flourish**


Last year, Flourish started a reset of Women's Ministry at Prairie Creek. We spent time listening to the Lord about how best we can serve you, the very busy women all around us!


